

Survey 1 General Themes/Comments

- General sentiment is people are excited and looking forward to this becoming a reality
- Multi-modal and public transit access/service to station, connectivity, and student access are all important issues
- Ease of access and proximity to other amenities is important
- Access to site depends on location, however most people can't walk/bike (although they would like to) and will likely have to drive
- All site features listed are important
- All environmental factors listed are important and care should be taken to minimize environmental impacts
- Both Ellett and Merrimac present challenges
- Both NRV Mall sites are preferred sites



- Completed surveys/# of respondents: 55%


Participant Location by State

How familiar are you with the railroad track locations within the New River Valley?




Summary of Comments:

- 181 comments ranging from "This would be great" to "Extend service to ... (SW Virginia)"
- "Access" was a recurring theme for different groups and modes of transportation
- Ellett is "least favorable" and the "NRV mall is most favorable"; consider density and nearby amenities

Please rank which elements you would consider first, second, and third when weighing the trade-offs in a station design.




- Station location ranked 1st priority; environmental impacts ranked 2nd priority; transit service to/from station ranked 3rd priority

- Parking, student access, and transit service to station are important

What are the top three (3) ways you would get to a station?




- Car ranked 1st priority; bus / public transit ranked 2nd priority; walking ranked 3rd priority
- Access to station will depend on location as most can't walk/bike, but would prefer to walk/bike or take
 public transit
- Student access and trail/bike access are important; connecting to larger transit network is key
- Concern regarding luggage unless one drives, takes bus, or has a friend drop them off

What site features would you prefer at a station?




Summary of Comments:

- Parking ranked 1st priority; bus drop-off ranked 2nd priority; enclosed seating ranked 3rd priority
- All of the amenities listed are important and should be considered
- Security and bus transfer are important to consider
- Accessibility and ADA compliance should be provided



Survey 1. Question 5.

What environmental factors are most important as they relate to a future station location?



- Community resources ranked 1st priority; protected species and critical habitat ranked 2nd priority; noise and vibration ranked 3rd priority; however, all the environmental factors were considered important
- Ellett should not be considered; NRV-W is favorable
- Choose the best location and avoid negative impacts to environment; concern about the development impact; providing transit will inherently cut down on vehicular traffic – this is great!



Did you watch or attend the New River Valley Passenger Rail Station Feasibility Study Public Meeting?





Method of participation(%)*




Do you consider yourself a year-round resident of the New River Valley?



Non year-round residents(%)*












Survey 2. Question 10. What is your gender?
