# Executive Director's Report DJ Stadtler, Executive Director, VPRA





### CRISI Grant Award: Franconia-Springfield Bypass

- The Federal Railroad Administration awarded VPRA a grant of \$100M for the Franconia-Springfield Bypass from the Consolidated Rail Infrastructure and Safety Improvements (CRISI) program.
  - This was the full amount VPRA requested, and the 4th largest of the 70 CRISI grants awarded.
  - An event was held on September 29 to announce the grant, and VPRA Chair Jen DeBruhl and Director Rod Hall were in attendance.
- The 0.9 mile bypass structure will allow passenger trains to:
  - Crossover to serve VRE stations on the west, north of Franconia, and on the east, south of Franconia.
  - Reduce conflicts between passenger and freight trains.
- The Project will be coordinated with the Franconia to Lorton Third Track project.
- Completion of this and other Phase 1 projects will enable further passenger trains, including on weekends and evenings.







### Project Highlight: Long Bridge in the News

- The Long Bridge Team hosted a media event to provide details on the project, stressing the importance of securing all the necessary funding to complete the bridge. The event was positively and widely covered, with all four DC TV affiliates present, as well as WTOP radio and The Washington Post.
- On September 15, progressive design-build proposals were received for the Long Bridge North Package.
- Test pile driving work begins in October.

### Administrative Updates

- The waiting area at the Richmond Staples Mill Station received modern seating, new ceiling tiles, and a fresh coat of paint. At the Norfolk Station, platform boarding location signage and Amtrak logos were installed to improve wayfinding.
- VPRA hosted a strategic marketing session with Pulsar, the marketing contractor for Amtrak Virginia.
   A marketing strategy is being developed to build awareness of passenger rail in the Commonwealth.
- During Rail Safety Week from September 17-24, VPRA hosted outreach events at Ashland and Alexandria stations, participated in a media event at Petersburg/Ettrick station, and sponsored rail safety messaging at a Washington Nationals game.





### Administrative Updates

- Executive Director DJ Stadtler participated on a panel at the RVA757 Connects 2023 Convergence conference. The panel focused on transportation priorities in the Hampton Roads area. Also on the panel were VDOT Commissioner Stephen Brich, Jon Lugbill from Richmond Sports Backers, and Bob Crum from the Hampton Roads Planning District Commission.
- In partnership with Operation Lifesaver and the Childrens' Museum of Richmond, VPRA staff interacted with the over 2,000 children and families who attended the museum September 23-24, educating the next generation on the importance of safety around tracks and trains. Other activities included train-themed story time with Miss Virginia Volunteer and crafts.




### Virginia-Supported Monthly Ridership and Station Activity


August saw a 9.8% increase in ridership year over year.

August 2023 saw the highest Virginia-supported ridership, exceeding the previous record set last month of 125,488.

Ticket revenues have suffered a significant decline in July and August (8% decline in average fare year over year) despite the record ridership.

Washington DC, New York, and Philadelphia were the most popular out of state destinations.


### Virginia-Supported Monthly Ridership by Route 2023 vs 2022

Norfolk at 11.1% (+5,072)


All four routes saw ridership growth year over year.

Virginia-Supported Service increased from five to eight daily roundtrips on July 11, 2022.










### Route 46: Washington – Roanoke – 2 Daily Roundtrips


Train 145(SB), which operates on Sundays, had the highest average daily ridership in August.



### Route 47: Washington – Newport News – 2 Daily Roundtrips


Train 194(NB), which operates on Saturdays, had the highest average daily ridership in July.






Slow orders, weather related, and commuter train interference







### Route 51: Washington – Richmond – 1 Daily Roundtrip

Conformed 30% design plans will be complete in Fall 2023. **Test pile driving in East Potomac Park will start the week of October 2. The North Package Proposals are under review. A preferred proposer should be identified in October 2023.** South Package Statements of Qualifications (SOQ) are due on November 30, 2023. The North Package is fully funded, and the South Package funds cover design and partial construction. **VPRA applied for full funding for the South Package through Fed-State Partnership from FRA on April 21, 2023, and we should know the results by the end of 2023.**

Parsons submitted an early works Site Clearing Package on September 23rd. The draft Boundary Survey submittal was received in September and is under review. The CM/GC Request for Proposal (RFP) was advertised on August 4th. Contractor proposals were received on September 11, 2023. The proposals are under review by the Evaluation Committee with ranking of proposals to be completed by October 20.



### Rolling 12-Month Trend Analysis



- For August, CRF revenues are on track with the estimate.






### **VPRA Investment Mix & Earnings**

**Rolling 12-Month Trend Analysis** 







Currently, the investments in LGIP EM and Allspring have a 0.6% and 0.5% market value loss, respectively. As assets in the portfolio are reinvested in higher-yield securities, the market value will continue to rebound. VPRA has the ability and intent to hold the investments until the market value has rebounded.



\*Allspring's Effective Yield has been reduced by investment management & custodian fees.

- VPRA continues to invest a majority (over 75%) of its cash in the LGIP as interest rates are expected to increase in the near term.
- LGIP's short-term strategy is advantageous during a time of interest rate increases. The longer-term maturities in Allspring and LGIP-EM will produce greater returns as interest rates level-off or decline.
- VPRA is close to finalizing selection of an entity to perform investment management services.
