REF created: Dedicated revenues for rail capital projects.

October

Lynchburg service began.

2010

July

Richmond service began.

2011

IPROC Fund created.

IPROC funded through sales & use tax.

2019

December

for Transforming Rail in Virginia announced.

2019

March

Schedule optimization.

October

Agreement with CSX Second Norfolk service began. Lynchburg service extended to Roanoke.

2017

2013

PRIIA 209: Virginia acquires four daily round-trips; two Richmond and two Newport News.

2012

December

Norfolk service began.

2020 July

Virginia Passenger Rail Authority established. Additional rail funding thru Commonwealth Rail Fund.

2021 May

Agreement with Norfolk-Southern for Western Rail Initiative announced.

2021 September

Richmond route extended to Main Street Station in Richmond, VA.

2022 July

Third Norfolk and second Roanoke service began.

Late 2020's


Completion of Phase 1 projects triggers third Newport News train and second Richmond train. Early 2030's

Completion of Phase 2 projects triggers 3 additional Richmond trains.






VRE Performance

VRE On-Time Performance: trains arrive at <u>last</u> scheduled stop within <u>6</u> minutes of schedule


VRE Last Station OTP and Delay Minutes




Endpoint On-Time Performance, Oct-Dec 2024






Amtrak Long-Distance Performance

Amtrak Long-Distance All-Station OTP and Delay Minutes (RF&P Only)^{1,2}




Oct-Dec 2024 All-Station On-Time Performance, Long-Distance¹

-Summer pilot schedules will be expanded for Summer 2025 to include additional trains




Delays at WAS

- Noticeable ongoing decreases in delay minutes at WAS
- WAS remains the top location for delays for Virginia service



Planned Work

- A-Interlocking work outages in fall were generally smooth
- Additional planned outages affecting service will occur in early 2025




Service Changes

Expanding the summer schedule pilot for 2025

Added time a function of:

- 50th percentile of incurred CSX heat orders during summer 2023-2024
- Amount of CSX recovery time already in the schedule
- Predicted improvement to all customer OTP
- Avoidance of long dwelling on non-heat order days
- Amount of scheduled time train travels on CSX between the 1:00pm-7:00pm heat order window

Schedules were indexed to WAS arrival/departure times (no changes to any stations on Northeast Corridor)



VPRA is currently working with Amtrak and CSX to finalize schedules to be in effect from Memorial Day-Labor Day




Monthly delays at WAS fell 74% from July to December








Top 5 Delayed Trains (Jul-Dec), by Month¹





Engine swaps continue to make up the largest share of delay minutes for southbound trains but significantly improved since the summer

Switch and signal reliability issues





Terminal congestion issues continue for VRE trains, especially in the PM



Interlocking construction at Washington Union Station will require weekend outages in early 2025



- Switch work will affect some weekend Amtrak Virginia Trains
 - No anticipated impact to VRE
- Impacted weekends:
 - January 31-February 3
 - February 22-23
 - March 8-9
 - May 16-19 (tentative)
- VPRA will continue to work with Amtrak to provide customer communications in advance of any service changes







Amtrak FTI Delay Distribution by Duration, Jul-Dec 2024




Norfolk Southern (NS) Performance Monitoring

- VPRA and NS will start monitoring the performance of passenger trains on NS corridors in Virginia in 2025.
- VPRA pays NS a premium rate to operate the 2nd and (future) 3rd Roanoke frequencies.
- After the completion of certain projects on NS, VPRA will have the right to reduce the rate depending on performance.

Past performance (for illustrative purposes only)



- (1) Customer OTP calculation is modified based on whether a train arrived on NS territory late.

Note:

- Newport News, Norfolk: Amtrak will independently make Airo upgrades to service facilities, including pit and canopy.
- Richmond: Airo upgrades, including pit and canopy, will be incorporated into VPRA's service facility plans.
- New River Valley: Airo facilities will be incorporated into VPRA's service facility plans; future Airo upgrades responsibility of Amtrak (i.e. pit/canopy)


