VPRA is hosting two public meetings to keep residents, businesses, and commuters in the Southwest DC Waterfront and Wharf area informed about the Long Bridge Project.

VPRA is working closely with District and Federal agencies to minimize disruptions to the public and address community concerns.

## What is the Long Bridge Project?

The Long Bridge Project will increase rail traffic capacity, create a four-track corridor, and construct approximately 1.8 miles of improvements, including five rail bridges and two bicycle/pedestrian bridges, over land and the Potomac River between Arlington, VA, and Washington, DC. Construction is currently underway and expected to finish in 2030.



### SOUTH PACKAGE


Constructs a rail bridge and bike/pedestrian bridge over the George Washington Memorial Parkway and Potomac River.

- A New Two Track Bridge Over the Potomac River
- 2 A New Bicycle Pedestrian Bridge Over the Potomac River
- 3 A New Two Track Bridge Over I-395
- 4 A New Four Track Bridge Over Ohio Drive SW

Constructs new bridges in DC, north of the Potomac River, as well as retaining walls, embankments, ground improvements, and crash walls.

- 6 A New Four Track Bridge Over the Washington Channel
- O A New Four Track Bridge Over Maine Avenue SW
- A New Pedestrian Bridge Over Maine Avenue SW
