

- Based on VPRA's Performance Fiscal Year from October 1 to September 30, with the exception of Ridership and Revenue based on State Fiscal Year from July 1 to June 30.

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

Long Bridge Project

Complete Long Bridge North Early Works Packages 1-3 (crash walls, tree clearing, test foundations) no later than April 1, 2026

- Crash walls increasing the height and thickness of crash walls to meet current standards; additional details on the following slides
- Tree clearing select tree removal to maintain project schedule
- Test Foundations— test drilled shafts and micropiles performed to inform final design





Crash Walls Overview

- The Long Bridge Project is modifying five crash walls (C-G) within the Maryland Avenue Overbuild
- The project will increase the height and thickness of the crash walls to meet current standards

 The purpose of a crash wall is to limit damage to a bridge structure from the impacts from collisions due to shifted train loads and any derailments










Begin construction for Alexandria Fourth Track Phase 2 (new fourth track and RO interlocking rebuild) no later than March 30, 2026




Franconia-Springfield Bypass

Complete platform concrete no later than June 30, 2026







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
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Other Key Organizational Goals

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The Importance of Asset Management


- VPRA is the owner* of a significant number of rail assets, including but not limited to track structures, bridges and culverts, drainage systems, stations, parking lots and other structures.
- Asset management is a holistic approach to asset lifecycle management from creation/purchase of an asset, through operations, maintenance, and replacement.





*VPRA has various agreements with rail stakeholders regarding who will maintain the assets, but VPRA still retains certain obligations as an owner.

Tasks to be completed for Asset Management



VPRA's purchase of the Manassas Line has accelerated the need for VPRA to establish several aspects of Asset Management:

- 1. Policy provides the umbrella/context for how VPRA will structure our Asset Management framework/plan.
- 2. Framework/Plan the elements that VPRA will develop and the steps VPRA will follow to perform asset management as an owner of assets, but not a maintainer/operator
- EAMS tool will serve as the repository for asset inventory, asset condition, inspection reports, & technical data and will enable VPRA to plan for maintenance and Capital costs related to our assets
