- Created in 2020 by the General Assembly
- Responsible for expanding and promoting passenger and commuter rail
- Given all powers necessary for carrying out its statutory purposes:
 - Manage passenger rail in Virginia
 - Design, build, finance, and maintain rail facilities
 - Direct recipient of USDOT Grants
- Partners with Amtrak and VRE to operate passenger and commuter rail service
- Governed by a 15-Member Board








Virginia Passenger Rail Network: 2025



- Four State-Supported Amtrak Routes: 8 daily roundtrips
 - o Roanoke: 2
 - o Richmond: 1
 - Newport News: 2
 - o Norfolk: 3
- Five Amtrak Long-Distance Roundtrips
- One NC State-Supported Roundtrip
- Two Virginia Railway Express (VRE) Commuter Routes:16 daily roundtrips
 - Manassas: 8
 - Fredericksburg: 8









These projects unlock new passenger rail service and set the stage for future service expansion.

Long Bridge Project Overview





South Package

- Two new tracks from RO Interlocking to North side of Ohio Dr. SW (west) in East Potomac Park
- New two-track bridge over the Potomac River and GWMP; retaining existing Long Bridge
- New bike/ped bridge over the Potomac River
- Design-Build contract awarded January 2025

North Package

- Two new tracks from LE Interlocking to the north side of Ohio Dr. SW(west) in East Potomac Park
- Bridges over I-395, Ohio Dr. SW (west), Washington Channel, Maine Ave. SW
- Retaining walls and crash walls
- Maine Ave. pedestrian bridge
- Progressive Design-Build contract awarded December 2023








Design & Construction Timeline

- Become part of DSLBD's inventory of over 2,000 active CBEs.
- Have a tool to assist your business with competing in DC government contracting opportunities.





CBE Local Business Enterprise Definition

Connecting Small and Local Businesses to DC Government Contracting Opportunities

- Principal office physically located in the District;
- Meets one of the following:
- Independently owned and operated; or
- More than 50% owned, operated, and controlled by a District-based enterprise or not-for-profit business; or
- Owned by a non-District-based business enterprise that is more than 50% owned by District residents.
- Chief Executive Officer and highest-level managerial employees of the business enterprise must perform their managerial functions in their principal office located in the District;
- Meets one of the four following standards:
- More than 50% of the employees of the business are residents of the District; or
- The owners of more than 50% of the business enterprise are residents of the District; or
- More than 50% of the assets of the business, excluding bank accounts, are in the District; or
- More than 50% of the business's gross receipts are District gross receipts.

Form of Agreement - Progressive Design Build

Consists of two phases


Phase 1

- Collaborative Development of Design from 30% to 60%. Notice to Proceed January 2024 Concluded in June 2025

Phase 2

- Completion of Design and Construction Notice to Proceed Issued July 3, 2025 Substantial Completion November 2030













Project Overview

Create a 4 Track Corridor in to the District. Adding two tracks and modifying the existing two tracks through East Potomac Park to L'Enfant Interlocking.

Work requires new railroad embankment as well as widening existing embankments, primarily employing earth retaining walls.

The southern limit of the project includes a new bridge complex crossing utilities, WMATA Yellow Line, and Interstate 395.

North of I-395 the widened alignment requires phased reconstruction of three railroad bridges: Ohio Drive SW (East), Washington Channel, and Maine Avenue.

Additionally, a pedestrian bridge over Maine Avenue will be replaced.

Other major work include utility relocation and trackwork.













Procurement is paced by development of design which will extend in to 2026
